

Transcript of Academy Meeting on Identity - Part Two

This academy meeting covered a great deal of material about identities that had never been discussed before. The four participants were Joachim Held, Alka Madan, Petra Held, and myself. This Academy meeting was one of the rare opportunities where we worked as a team and shared realizations about identities.

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David St Lawrence

That breaks the internet for me, all right. Identity, the whole thing. See, that's what people want is an identity. Take a look at your own identities right now. What do you think of your identity as.

Joachim Held

Dangerous! Yes. (laughs)

David St Lawrence

Okay, so if you are going to become or do something else, you'd actually have to change your identity. See, If Alka is going to buy a 200 acres in some beautiful part of the country and set up a living space for learning spiritual values, and things like that, she would be changing her identity.

David St Lawrence

People have already done this. There's books and information written about what kind of places to be near, and what resources are needed to set up such a community. I don't mean a commune. I mean, a spiritual community, there's actually articles written about what do you have to do to establish a spiritual community.

David St Lawrence

You see, we established an online spiritual community with Spiritual Rescue Technology, which by not involving MEST (matter, energy, space, and time), gives us a certain degree of freedom. But if this community became really significant, it would mean that what we were looking for is a new identity.

David St Lawrence

In our personal lives we often wish to change identities. A person decides things like I want to be respected as an author. I want to be a good mother. I want to be a gypsy again. Yes.

Alka Madan

Another thing I just came to the continuation of what Joachim said that you know, you can give identity to your beings to help them manifest through you.

David St Lawrence

Of course. Of course, because aren't they a part of your identity? You know, you go from being happy, golucky, whatever, to a mode of existence where you need to look things up. Everything needs to be correct. You need to fix this and that, and you say things to others like, "If you're going to succeed in life, you know, you have to do all of these things to succeed. You talk to somebody like you are a mentor or something, and that's a different identity than your happy-go-lucky identity.

David St Lawrence

Let me just finish that. That person speaking is the being running the body. If you, in that role, acknowledge to yourself, oh, I've got a mentor spirit. I've got a mentor guy or I have an executive guy here or I have a stand up comedian guy. That bridges the gap and you operate as a team. Thank you. Go ahead, please.

Alka Madan

Because as soon as Joachim said that, you know, million of my bulbs lit up because all my beings are saying,

Yes! Yes! We need identity. (laughter)

David St Lawrence

Have them take a number and you will get to them soon! (laughter)

Alka Madan

I will have a different kind of relationship with my spiritual universe now, because I will appreciate their desire to have an identity and I will not come as a barrier in between if sometimes they want to take over.

Alka Madan

And wow..

David St Lawrence

Wow... wow. (laughter and chatter as realizations occur)

David St Lawrence

Okay. We're passing identities around here. Go ahead. Yeah,

Petra Held

I looked up name or noman in Latin. And it's very interesting because you see there. It's a name. It's a title. It's a family, a person's name. And it's popular for people. It is a famous name, if a person is very famous. Yeah. It is so, so many things. Yeah. So I would say identity is generally a term, and name is a little bit more precise, perhaps because we all have names, at least one name and two names, first name, last name, and so on. So, and we have names for all the stuff that is around us. That's like an identity too, right?

Alka Madan

So that means as soon as you lose your name, so your existence in physical universe is over.

David St Lawrence

Very interesting, right?

Alka Madan

And that is maybe the most discomfoting thing for a being.

David St Lawrence

I got that. That's what my guys are saying too. You are no longer Henry Wadsworth, or Hitler, or General Patton, or whatever you were.

Alka Madan

So you know in our culture, in the Indian culture. They just once a year, they just celebrate them (the departed) by name. They keep one day for them. So maybe this is something people like, or maybe people are haunting you and they want you to recognize them, and they want you not to forget about them, yet. And they want you to have their pictures in your room and you know your stuff to them. Maybe this is all....

David St Lawrence

the family portraits, family portraits on the wall. Oh, wow. It's because the identity does include the name, doesn't it?

Alka Madan

Definitely, and this is the biggest loss I think a person gets when he loses identity in the physical universe.

David St Lawrence

Suppose suppose the spirit never had a name. I mean, he's got an identity as a Mongol warrior, and there were millions of them, riding their little ponies across the steppes, etc.

Joachim Held
(holds up hand)

David St Lawrence
After reflection, I'm sure they had names. Yes. Okay. Go ahead. Take it from there Joachim.

Joachim Held
Yeah, I think what comes to me that loss of havingness, there's loss of identity and loss of havingness is a loss of importance and of life. (Havingness: The fact or state of having or possessing something.)

Alka Madan
Loss of significance, you know,

David St Lawrence
Look at Alma Deutscher. She is channeling beings. And we know that they're composers, every so often somebody recognizes what she's doing. They realize she's channeling this particular composer or that particular composer, sometimes it's a blend of them. In this way, they are recognizing the identities of these composers. At the same time she's living her life as a major composer with her own identity.

Alka Madan
I get the feeling from my beings, that all this produces grief about losing this game.

David St Lawrence
What could we do? What could we do to make them happy again?

Alka Madan
They're just telling me you don't even value what you got, you know?

David St Lawrence
No, no, I'm talking about you guys (addressing Alka's beings). You had an identity. Is there some way we can honor that identity? Or that you can show us that identity? If you can't show us your name at least your identity?
(VERY LONG PAUSE)

Joachim Held
This is the most basic thing acknowledgement. Acknowledgement terminates a cycle of action and the cycle of communication.

Alka Madan
Yeah, so for acknowledgment, I will want to add that for beings acknowledgement is, "I see you." Not that I listen to you, because if you tell them "I see you", I am really acknowledging their existence.

David St Lawrence
How about, "I recognize you. Oh, there you are."

Joachim Held
Is it a kind of infinite admiration?

David St Lawrence
Yes. Petra, your turn.

Petra Held

It's about identity name nomen significance, meaning So, if you have no name, you have no significance. Or if you have no identity, you have no meaning, have nothing to say.

David St Lawrence

Could your skill set be part of your identity? Like when when I am talking to one of my beings. When I invoke one of them, I can sing again, you see. (demonstrates) When I do that you get the feeling that there's somebody there that was able to sing and influence others through their voice.

Petra Held

Yeah, first the body is you can see and it has its significance. It's visible.

David St Lawrence

Okay, but how about the ones like Alka is saying, who are our invisible friends? If they have a skill set, if they had a trade, if they're a warrior, a priest, a minister, a healer? Isn't that part of an identity?

Petra Held

They are identities. Of course! Yeah,

David St Lawrence

Right. I mean, we don't know that a particular spirit was called George or whatever his name is, we do know that he was a healer, maybe in the 12th century, he can give us that much.

Petra Held

Say the body looks like this and this and that. Wears glasses and so on, but still has no name. So there is no significance, you know,

David St Lawrence

At least not that kind, but what does the person do? Isn't it be, do, and have? What did the person do?

Petra Held

if you would reduce the person to the body it's really woo woo, you know. (laughter)

Petra Held

So there is much more like, names, and hats (roles), are part of the identity too.

David St Lawrence

Well, isn't identity involved with what the body can do? In other words, when you were a skier, you see, you have a different identity than somebody who was a baker. But if you're in your kitchen, and the baker sort of says, No, no, let's do this, let's put a little barley in it instead.

David St Lawrence

I have the feeling that we're moving in the right direction. Joachim started it and Alka got the game started out good. It's like if we can recognize the need to have an identity, we can help others. We can do things that let us know what their identity is, or encourage them to share their identity with us. Because there are identities that we can use right now, abilities to speak, to be an orator, or to be a healer.

Petra Held

Yeah, let's say that, that my beings like to be identified as someone special. With this and that traits, different traits, but they do not want to be like each other. In a mass.

David St Lawrence

Thank you, and what else? What else are they saying to us? This is a chance to learn more. We are talking about stuff we have never talked about before. You guys are on, all of you. What counts, what matters to you?

Alka Madan

Another thing you know, is that physical universe games have so much significance by all of us put together, that one being takes a big loss when he's not playing physical universe games. So this is the indoctrination we have to do while we're still in the body to reduce the significance in our games.

David St Lawrence

To reduce the?

Alka Madan

significance in the games we are playing

David St Lawrence

and how do we reduce the significance?

Alka Madan

That's what we have to work upon. Now, it's so important to us, I'm so and so and I'm doing this and you know, and that's when we lose it, (by dying), then we will be stuck with it.

David St Lawrence

Well, if you were a lawyer, or in your case, an ongoing spiritual leader, while being an executive entrepreneur, that's a beingness. Right? And you and all of your beings, you're creating that identity. And if you were to change your supporting spiritual beings, you could change your identity. Like for instance, changing from being somebody who's an executive and responsible for people moving to America, to being somebody who has acreage and a spiritual community someplace, that's a different identity.

Alka Madan

No, but I can answer your question that you know, if I'm so stuck in being whatever, my different roles are, that is like being heavy in significance. And if I just take it easy, it will work out.

David St Lawrence

Does it make any difference to you that the identity that you're creating is being added to or helped by other beings?

David St Lawrence

You see, because I could say, I want to be less shy or maybe I want to be less arrogant. (laughter) Let's say that I know so much that I get arrogant. Maybe I would like to change that. I don't have to go around being careful. I could just go find the beings who are creating that attitude and say, "Look, we're on top. Let's enjoy it." Then move them off to the beach or something.

David St Lawrence

Is that real to you?

Alka Madan

I'm just tapping into the spiritual universe now and I see that there are beings, disoriented, they know nothing. What to do? Just floating endlessly. So I think that is our work to do.

David St Lawrence

Would you recruit them, the ones that are just floating? Or would you find ones that would like to build a
